SOME OF OUR OWN **AFTAC'S TIES TO KOREAN ORPHANS SPAN DECADES** PATRICK-BASED UNIT GOT INVOLVED IN EARLY 1960s

When the time came to collect toys for children at an orphanage in South Korea or making repairs at the children's home, the men and women of the Air Force Technical Applications Center responded with enthusiasm. "We'd go out and spend time with the kids," said Chief Master Sgt. Edward Lindsay, who was stationed as part of AFTAC's Detachment 452 in Woniu. South Korea, three times since 1984.... "We'd do things like repair washer and drvers. It was a constant interaction." ... It continues to be a great opportunity for the seven airmen who comprise the detachment to be involved with the community near their station. "It was a family atmosphere." Lindsay said. "It was a heartfelt thing to do that."





JOHNSON, Willis Return, (Bill) MSgt, USAF, Retired July 28, 1927 - November 19, 2012.

Retired United States Air Force Master Sergeant Willis (Bill) Return Johnson slipped peacefully away into the arms of the Angels. His departure to his next mission occurred at 8:15 am., Monday November 19, 2012 at Doctors Medical Center in San Pablo, California. He was surrounded by family members at the time of his passing.

Bill was born to Willis Milton Johnson and Henrietta Victoria CAREY Johnson of Cheswold Delaware.

Bill was the oldest of six children, having been preceded in death by his sister Calanthia Johnson, brother Charles Johnson and sister Ardella "Dell" JOHNSON Durham (Clinton Durham Sr. of Cheswold, Delaware). He is survived by his sister Dolores JOHNSON Carney Rivera of Kingman, Arizona; and brother Stanley Johnson (Patricia Johnson) of Felton Delaware. He also is survived by six nephews: Pete Carney (of Arizona), Clinton Jr., Steve, and Keith Durham, (of Delaware) Michael, and Jason Johnson (of Delaware); as well as numerous grand nieces and nephews.

Bill was a full blooded Native American from the Lenape Indian Tribe of Delaware as was also of a member of the tribe. His Native name is "Thunder One."

He is survived by an ex-wife, two daughters who are, Paula Wimmer (her husband Chris) and their three children Christian, Rebekah, and Naomi of Pinole, California. He is also survived by Brenda Odle, her daughters Dena Walls (her husband Fred) and Michelle Roseman-Yeo (her husband Mark) both of El Cerrito, California. Bill had the pleasure of 4 great-grandchildren - Antonio and Julian Walls and Charles and Juliet Sutherland. His grandchildren all know him as "Grandpa Dude/Gramps" and his Great-Grandchildren know him as "Pop Pop."

Bill was a World War II veteran. His military service took him to Germany, North Africa, Turkey, and various other United States Air Forces Bases. Upon entry into the service, his training took him into the field of weather service of the Army Air Corps. He provided weather analysis and reporting for air traffic. After a few years of this service, he was transferred to a secret mission where he provided analysis on the use of Special Weapons. To his departing day, his special weapons work was never spoke of. He had the highest degree of integrity and never divulged this top secret clearance work.

After retirement from the Service, he lived in numerous locations that included, Las Vegas, Nevada, Lake Havasu and Topock Arizona, Anacortes, Washington, Sacramento, Larkspur, and West Sacramento, California. He loved to travel as well as attend jazz festivals, bluegrass and western swing events, car races, Baseball games as well as Spring training. Bill was very outgoing and he never met a stranger.

Bill was a person that lived life to its fullest. If there was something that needed to be done, it was done. He will be missed dearly. As his family says, NO words could describe him; you had to "experience him."

### AFTAC – Long Range Detection Alumni Worldwide Reunion 13 – 16 June 2013 Aurora, Colorado

Having held highly successful reunions in Florida in 2009 and again in California in 2011, it's now time to come to Colorado in 2013 and we are ready to start taking reservations. Included with this issue of the newsletter is this overview, hotel information, and registration form.
- What we need from you: mark your calendars now for 13 16 June 2013, register early by completing the reunion registration form and returning it along with your check, reserve your hotel room by calling the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Denver-Aurora, or by going to the hotel website (see the hotel information sheet for details). And, please pass the word along to other alumni who might not be members of any of the alumni chapters. Membership in an alumni chapter is not required to attend the reunion. Early registration will allow better planning by the reunion committee and some planned activities are tentative depending on the responses we get on the registration forms. If you have any questions, please contact one of the committee members listed at the bottom of this page.
- <u>Hospitality Room</u>: We will have a hospitality room in the DoubleTree Hotel open daily beginning Thursday afternoon, 13 June. This is where you sign in and pick up your welcome package if not available in the hotel lobby. Look for the alumni welcome table in the hotel lobby and for information on the electronic sign board.as to the hospitality room location. Name tags will be provided in the welcome package so please list names on the registration form as you want them to appear on the tags.
- <u>Det 418 Mini-Reunion Thursday afternoon/evening, 13 June:</u> There will be a mini-reunion for Det 418 alumni in conjunction with the main reunion. People attending this mini-reunion must return the registration form the same as those attending the main reunion. Additional information on this event is being provided by Frank Calenda. See bottom of page for contact information.
- <u>Golf Outing, Friday morning, 14 June:</u> This is a tentative item depending on the number of people signing up for it, and if held will be at the Heather Ridge Country Club, now a public course, just a few blocks from the DoubleTree hotel. It will be arranged by Lonnie Gibbons with shuttle bus transportation available from the hotel. Cost is listed at \$40 each on the registration form and refunds will be made if the actual cost is less or the event is cancelled due to lack of interest. Please note that the cost includes 18 holes with golf cart and that rental clubs at the golf course are very limited.
- <u>Wings Over the Rockies Museum, Friday morning/afternoon, 14 June:</u> This is also a tentative item depending on the number of people signing up for it. The museum is located in one of the large hangars on the former Lowry AFB just a few blocks from the former Det 57 and SPINSTRA schoolhouse, Bldgs 358 & 359. We will attempt to arrange hotel shuttle bus transportation but this is subject to availability. Museum admission cost is \$ 9.00 for seniors (65+), veterans, and active duty to be paid at the museum. <u>www.wingsmuseum.com</u>
- <u>Det 45 Operations Tour, Buckley AFB, Saturday morning, 15 June:</u> The detachment will provide tour escorts and a show and tell of their satellite operations area. This is inside a restricted area, so additional personal information will be required to obtain visitor clearance. Transportation will be provided from the hotel for those who need it.
- <u>Reception Icebreaker, Friday evening, 14 June:</u> DoubleTree Hotel, AFTAC Ballroom, informal mixer with cash bar and mixed hors d'oeuvres buffet, including Teriyaki beef and pulled pork skewers, coffee and tea. Dress is casual.
- <u>Reunion Banquet, Saturday evening, 15 June:</u> DoubleTree Hotel, AFTAC Ballroom, social with cash bar followed by sit-down dinner with choice of Prime Rib, French Cut Chicken Florentine, or Atlantic Salmon entrees. Guest speaker to be announced.
