THE LEGEND OF THE "LADY OF THE LAKE"

EIELSON AIR FORCE BASE, Alaska --

Since moving to Eielson in July 2013, I have heard numerous tales about the mysterious "Lady of the Lake." I always assumed it was some ghost legend of a woman who drowned in a lake and haunts people who look for her, but boy was I wrong.

Recently, I began to look into the real history of the Lady of the Lake, as I enjoy ghost tales and wanted to learn more. To my surprise, it had nothing to do with a woman at all. No, it is actually about a WB-29 Bomber aircraft that has been abandoned for ages in its watery final resting place.

She is a World War II era bomber that partially sticks out of the water, and just a few short summers ago, her true history was unearthed.

A team of divers began an expedition and found that when the bomber, whose tail number is 44-62214, was operational she flew between Alaska and Japan, detecting evidence of Soviet nuclear testing in 1949. The divers also found a table with grease pencil writing that depicted the names of the crewmembers on the mission and confirmed the tail number of the bomber.

This was a fascinating and educational discovery for me, but the more I read, the more I began to wonder just how the bomber ended up in the lake to begin with.

According to Jack Waid, the former Historian for Eielson, there is no record of how the plane ended up in the lake, only hearsay and legends to go off of. Sometime before 1964, the aircraft ended up in the lake, whether it was considered an eyesore, moved because of damage, or put there specifically for training purposes.

The diving crews did find evidence that would support the theory of having the plane put in the lake intentionally for egress training. This evidence included an A-frame apparatus that would have been used for water rescue training.

This just goes to show you that speculation of any event can lead to misinformation and unfounded rumors. Where I thought a ghost story existed was actually a historical story of the first B-29 Bomber to detect Soviet nuclear testing. It still leaves me to wonder how she mysteriously ended up in the bottom of an unforgettable lake. 2

DETACHMENT 460

Eielson AFB Published October 11, 2017

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Detachment 460 is to monitor and record natural and man-made seismic disturbances in the earth in conjunction with the Air Force Technical Applications Center's nuclear treaty monitoring mission.

BACKGROUND

The Air Force Technical Applications Center's Detachment 460, located at Eielson Air Force Base, Alaska, conducts nuclear treaty monitoring through seismic and atmospheric data collection. Findings from this data is reported to national decision makers through AFTAC's headquarters at Patrick Air Force Base, Fla. Detachment 460 is a tenant organization of the 354th Fighter Wing at Eielson AFB. It is the largest and most varied detachment of its type of AFTAC's numerous worldwide detachments.

Det 460 operates and maintains the most comprehensive seismic network in the United States Atomic Energy Detection System (USAEDS). Up until 2016, the detachment managed seven seismic arrays, many of them north of the Arctic Circle. Today, the detachment manages five after the 2016 decommissioning of Attu Island and Alaska Long Period Arrays. The current 35 seismic instruments are spread across these five arrays employing different electronics packages in geologically advantageous sites. The five seismic sites include the local array located at Eielson AFB; the Burnt Mountain array (north of Fort Yukon on the edge of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge); the Indian Mountain array; the Tatalina array; and the Beaver Creek array located on the Alaska-Canada Border south of the Alaskan town of Tok. This gives Det 460 a comprehensive view of the dynamics of the earth worldwide.

The Det also operates and maintains a network of gaseous and particulate air sampling units to detect airborne signatures of nuclear events. The atmospheric systems are located on Eareckson AFB (Shemya Island), Point Barrow and at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson. These five specialized instruments at three different locations round out Det 460's broad support to a nationally vital mission. Stretching from far above the Arctic Circle to the Canadian border and out to the Aleutian Island Chain, Det 460's area of responsibility comprises a vast and unique set of geographic, climatic and cultural challenges. From stifling heat and bugs in the summer to the extreme rigors of the remote Arctic in the winter, detachment personnel routinely overcome significant obstacles to provide a 24/7 vigilant watch for America and its allies.

HISTORY

Detachment 460 has a long and distinguished history in the service of the United States Atomic Energy Detection System. Its roots are actually derived from several AFTAC detachments scattered across the "Last Frontier" in the late 1950s. During this era, there were six detachments and approximately 200 AFTAC personnel in Alaska.

Eielson AFB was activated June 14, 1944. It was known as Mile 26 Airfield, and was an auxiliary field for Ladd field, presently called Ft. Wainwright. Air sampling operations conducted from Alaska in the late 1940s provided the first evidence that confirmed that Russia had exploded an Atomic bomb. Daily surveillance sampling flights were flown from Eielson AFB for the next 25 years.

Editor's note: There must be interesting stories from all of you who served in Alaska at one time or another that would interest our readers. Det 460 has been around for a long time and, knowing how "different" you "B" guys are, send me some stories of your experiences.

PHONE SCAMS

These crooks use software that allows them to display fake numbers that are hard to resist Criminals sometimes program auto-dialers to make repeated calls to you, each disconnecting after just one ring. They know this might spur you into calling back the displayed number out of curiosity, since it usually has a local area code, or you want to complain. There's double trouble if you call area codes such as 268, 664 and 876. These are for Caribbean countries and other places that have high per-minute phone charges. One scam involves getting you to call one of those numbers, then getting you to hold through transfers that rack up your bill until a scammer gets on the line and starts a fraudulent pitch.

MANAGE YOUR RETIREMENT PAY: EDUCATE YOUR BENEFICIARIES

For the past five years the McClellan Retiree Activities Office (RAO) has been processing death notifications and helping widows & widowers apply for benefits at the rate of at least one per week.

We find about two-thirds of the people we help are not prepared with enough up-to-date information to complete the notification and application processes.

The reason is that the military retirees did not keep their beneficiaries informed as to what to do or where their records and pertinent information is kept.

The following website has the latest Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) information that will help you.

If you cannot access this website, just come into our office and we can get you the help you need.

We can complete all the necessary paperwork and submit it to DFAS when the need arises. We also have a detailed Retiree Casualty Assistance checklist available to help you with the preplanning you need to do.

Every military base has a Casualty Assistance Office that will fill out all the necessary paperwork for you and most have a Retiree Activities Office to help also should you need it.

You can call DFAS directly, however you may wait several minutes to a couple hours to talk to someone.
